What are we learning this month?

ELA:

- **Skills**: In Unit 4, we will read a variety of informational texts related to the big idea, *Live and Learn*. We will discuss the essential question, "How do the interactions we have with the people, places, and things in our world affect us?"
- **Writing**: We will research a type of dangerous weather and create a news bulletin and infographic.
- <u>Phonics</u>: We will decode and blend words using <u>silent letters</u> spelled with wr, kn, gn, mb, & sc; words using the <u>ûr sound</u> (like in "shirt") spelled with er, ir, ur, & or; words using the <u>ôr</u> <u>and är sounds</u> (like in "corn" and "star") spelled with or, ore, oar, & ar.

MATH:

Unit 5→Patterns, Functions, and Change

The following skills and concepts are the "big ideas" that are developed in this unit:

- Use repeated addition to find the number of objects in an array
- Skip count by 2s, 5s, and 10s
- Use manipulatives, drawings, tools, and notation to show place value understanding

Unit 6→Addition, Subtraction, and the Number System (Part 3)

The following skills and concepts are the "big ideas" that are developed in this unit:

- Adding & subtracting using numbers up to 1000
- Coin equivalencies & combinations to \$1.00

(This unit builds on the work we did in Units 1 & 3, but we are working with larger numbers.)

SCIENCE:

Unit 1: (Whack-a-Wall)

- We are going to continue working to discover the answer to our essential question: What are the best materials to engineer a strong wall?
- We will be testing different types of mortar for absorbency, describing physical properties
 of materials, identifying reversible and irreversible changes, and finally, we will build, test and
 improve our walls.
