A Look at Our Curriculum

*ELA- We are finishing up our first unit of ELA where students practiced reading and writing narratives about their lives and experiences. In our next unit, we will be reading and writing stories that teach morals and lessons. Students will also be reading stories where we will explore different central messages and author point of view by identifying key details in the text.

*Math- We just began our second unit, "Strategies and Properties of Addition and Subtraction", students have been using place value, properties of operations, and number sense to perform multi-digit calculations. We have been learning about and using many different strategies daily. Students will also be organizing, displaying, and interpreting data by constructing and reading graphs.

*SSH: We have finished one rotation of Social Studies where we looked at the diversity in Asia which includes geography, civics, culture, and history. Our next Social Studies rotation will take a look at the diversity of South America. In science we have been learning about forces and how they are all around us. Students are thinking about forces and applying them to their lives. Students are also trying to solve real world problems by thinking of ways to create a playground that can teach other children about forces. In our first rotation of Health, we learned about managing and expressing our emotions and how to use our Big Voices. For our upcoming rotation, students will be learning how to effectively communicate with their peers and how to make important decisions by following steps.
