So excited to see so many CTES students checking out new titles in the library! Please remind students to return books on their library day. Here is a glimpse of what we have been working on during the first month of school!

Pre-K: Introduction to our school library space, people and resources in the library, and book care Kindergarten: Library Citizens- Understanding rules that we follow as a library citizen, how books are organized, and how to check out books.

#### This month in Art:

**Pre K:** Learned how to draw different types of lines and shapes, along with identified the colors of the rainbow and how to use glue sticks to make a collage.

Kindergarten: Finished their Rainbow Fish painting and identified the terms pattern and habitat.

1st: Began their reptile unit and identified what makes reptiles unique before making a snake drawing, chameleon painting, and crocodile collage.

2<sup>nd</sup>: Defined the term nocturnal and habitat before identifying different types of owls as inspiration for an owl collage.

**3**<sup>rd</sup>: Examined the beautiful and ornate artwork of the ancient Egyptians as inspiration to draw and illustrate our own sarcophagus.

4<sup>th:</sup> Viewed the teepees of the Sioux Native American tribe of South Dakota before using Sioux symbols and patterns to illustrate, fold, and cut out a 3D teepee.

5<sup>th</sup>: Introduced to Nike basketball lead designer Leo Chang and his Kevin Durant shoe designs before drawing and illustrating our own custom Nike shoe design.
